Health and Sports group	They played volley ball and badminton from 5:30pm - 6:00pm everyday. There were around 15 youth joined and played.	
English Class	Normally 25 youth joined the class (19 female). Start at 6pm-7pm from Monday to Friday.	
Literacy Class	Normally 3 youth joined (3 female). Start 7pm-8pm from Monday to Friday.

English class Monday – Friday	There were 30 youths (12 men) studied English regularly 14 day. The class starts from 6:00-7:00 pm.	
Training on Micro Enterprise Development (MED)	On going process. There were 25 youths joined. The training was still not finished yet, so FFs decided to do training every Sunday evening (if possible) until finish.	
Health and Sport Group	Around 17 youth joined every evening. We played volley ball and badminton.	
Meetings with local authorities	12 times with village Chief (4 times/month), 3 times with commune Chief (once a month with SF) and 1 time with district governor.

3. MAJOR CHALLENGES AND SOLUTIONS

After finished rice field some of youth did not have work to do so they wanted to go to Thailand. FFs went to their house and encouraged them to think again and again, to work far from house especially work in other countries was risky and showed the good example of income generation opportunities in their own villages by using their own resources.

4. MAJOR INSIGHTS AND LESSONS LEARNED

Through PPC-YEs training, coaching and mentoring most of youth were improving in communication, more confidence, brave, self-help and able to help their villagers.

5. THE COMMUNITY

The community of PPC-YEs is youth, youth's families, villagers, local authorities, PPC-YEs staff, other organizations and donors.

6. GENDER ISSUES

PPC-YEs based on the criteria/gender balance. Approximately 69.92% are female (93 females/133 youth at Chek and Prey Chhkar). Mostly males were homeless, in the first year (2012) 87% are female) YSG leaders are female; the villagers started seeing the female have the same rights as male. Hopefully gender balance will be balanced and growing well and enjoyed by all stakeholders.
