So FFs always reviewed lessons and methods every week by sharing ideas from each other, especially entrepreneurship's idea done by FFs and youth to help other youth before they start their business.

The education is the best way for strengthening youth to living by high abilities and unity with people around them.

The community of PPC-YEs is youth, youth's families, villagers, local authorities, local schools, PPC-YEs staff and donors.

6. GENDER ISSUES

PPC-YEs based on the criteria/gender balance. Approximately 72.26% are female (99 females/137 youth at Chek and PreyChhkar).

YSG leaders are female; the villagers started seeing the female have the same rights as male. Hopefully gender balance will be continuing and growing well and enjoyed by all stakeholders.

7. NETWORKING AND GOVERNMENT RELATIONS

PPC-YEs continued trying the best to build network with other NGOs when it was possible.

8. ENVIRONMENT

Youth had promoting Organic farm and clean village, recycle plastic and one youth one tree to help planet changes

9. HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT

PPC-YEs staff joined regular staff meetings at PPC Office to share to and learn from other projects/ programs under PPC.

FFs has regular meeting with ED at PPC-YEs office in Siem Reap province normally once a month.

10. MONITORING/EVALUATION ACTIVITIES

PPC-ED visited the project field and did follow up by phone calls and met with Youth and YSG leaders. FFs visited the project fields and gave the visit reports/monthly reports to ED and shared the challenges and solutions. ED read the reports and gave comments to FFs. PPC Executive Director visited PPC-YEs fields and gave more advice.
