### 3. MAJOR CHALLENGES AND SOLUTIONS

Most of youth still wanted to work in other countries. So FFs always show them through case studies from the real situation faced by the workers. FFs also always build the capacity of them by training, teaching, coaching, mentoring, communication, creating network and encouraged them.

### 4. MAJOR INSIGHTS AND LESSONS LEARNED

The youth committed to break the word of "Frogs in the well", PPC-YEs project tried facilitating them what they can do. The youth camp was encouraged them and gave them hope.

The community of PPC-YEs is youth, youth's families, villagers, local authorities, PPC-YEs staff and donors.

### 6. GENDER ISSUES

PPC-YEs based on the criteria/gender balance. Approximately 74.40% are female (93 females/125 youth at Chek and Preychhkar).

YSG leaders are female; the villagers started seeing the female have the same rights as male. Hopefully gender balance will be continuing and growing well and enjoyed by all stakeholders.
