They borrowed in purposes: 16 youths for pig raising, 1 youth for developing restaurant, 2 youth for developing their grocery shop. Cash on hand <b>571,300 R (1582.13 shares)</b> . There were <b>24</b> youth joined SCG (5 men).

Most of youth in project were changed their attitude and wanted to help themselves and others but their parents did not agree with them to try because they thought that their children too young, no knowledge, no experience and no money. So FFs planned regular visits to their houses to build relationship with their parents and show them about their children's achievement in YEs project and their children's plan what they want to be in the future.

### 4. MAJOR INSIGHTS AND LESSONS LEARNED

Youth started knowing about living securely in the village and better than other places. Some youth said that they would not go to Thailand because it was so difficult and received similar salary when they worked in the village.

### 5. THE COMMUNITY

The community of PPC-YEs is youth, youth's families, villagers, local authorities, PPC-YEs staff and donors.

### 6. GENDER ISSUES

PPC-YEs based on the criteria/gender balance. Approximately 65.51% are female (95 females/145 youth in Chek and Preychhkar).

YSG leaders are female; the villagers started seeing the female have the same rights as male. Hopefully gender balance will be continuing and growing well and enjoyed by all stakeholders.

### 7. NETWORKING AND GOVERNMENT RELATIONS

PPC-YEs continued trying the best way to build network with other NGOs when it was possible. Local school named Chek primary school now are partnering with YEs project.
